Colorful Creations

One of the smallest butterflies in the world is the North American western pygmy blue. It has an average wingspan of less than 1.5 cm (0.5 in).

Some butterflies, such as the monarch and the painted lady, migrate from one area to another. Monarchs have been known to travel more than 5,000 km (2,175 mi).

The clearing is a type of butterfly that does not have scales on its wings. The lack of scales makes its wings transparent.

The brilliant blue wings of South American butterflies called "morphos" are sometimes used to make jewelry.

There are more than 18,000 different kinds of butterflies.

WING DINGS

A butterfly's wings are covered with tiny scales that overlap like the shingles on a roof. The "dust" you see when you touch a butterfly wing is actually scales that have been removed from the wing. If too many of the scales are removed, the butterfly will not be able to fly.

Two of the largest butterflies in the world are the Queen Alexandra's birdwing of Papua New Guinea, with a wingspan of up to 25 cm (10 in), and the African giant swallowtail, with a wingspan of up to 25 cm (9 in).

The front edge of a butterfly's wing is stiff. The rest of the wing is more flexible. If a predator damages the flexible parts of the wing, the butterfly may still be able to fly. If the front edge of the wing is damaged, the butterfly will not be able to fly.

Metamorphosis

All butterflies go through four stages of development: egg, larva (caterpillar), pupa and adult. When a caterpillar is full-grown, it will shed its exoskeleton one last time to become a "pupa." The exoskeleton of the pupa begins to harden into a shell called a "chrysalis." The pupa will stay in the chrysalis until it later emerges as a butterfly. Some butterflies may stay in their chrysalis for more than a year.

While most butterflies feed mainly on flower nectar, they will also feed on rotting fruit, dead animals and animal droppings.

Why was the butterfly so smart? It was a good pupa.

Some people believe butterflies carry the souls of deceased humans.

Butterflies use their antennae to smell for food and find mates.

Some butterflies have markings on their wings that resemble false heads. The false heads are used to draw predators away from the vital parts of the butterfly.

Butterflies feed through a long tube called a "proboscis." The proboscis is coiled when not in use.

Many species of butterflies have short front legs called "brush feet" that are used to "taste" the surface on which the butterfly is standing.

Butterflies are often seen gathering around mud puddles. This behavior is known as "puddling." Butterflies do this to gain nutrients they cannot get from flower nectar.

A butterfly cannot fly if the temperature in its thorax (the body part that holds the wings) is less than 25° C (77° F). If it is colder than this, the butterfly must first "warm up" its flight muscles by basking in the sun or shivering.

Most adult butterflies live for only a week or two. Some may live for over a year.

Fossilized butterflies have been found that scientists believe are over 40 million years old.
